## NBA 2K24 SUMMER LEAGUE FORMAT

**OVERVIEW:** All 30 NBA teams will participate in the NBA 2K24 Summer League 2023 in Las Vegas.

**NUMBER OF GAMES:** A total of 76 games will be played. Each team will play at least five games. Each team will play four games from July 7-14.

**FOUR-TEAM TOURNAMENT:** After each team plays four games, the top four teams will advance to the playoffs and participate in a semifinal game (July 16), and the two semifinal game winners will participate in the championship game (July 17). The top four playoff seeds will be determined by winning percentage with tiebreakers set forth below.

**CONSOLATION GAMES:** The 26 teams that do not advance to the four-team playoff will play a fifth game on either July 15 or July 16.

### TIEBREAK CRITERIA

**TWO TEAMS TIED:** If two teams have the same record after the first four games, the following criteria (in order) will be utilized:

**Head-to-head matchup:** The team that won the game between the two teams, if applicable, will receive the higher seed.

**Point differential:** The team with the greater point differential will receive the higher seed.

**Total Points:** The team with the most total points will receive the higher seed.

**Random drawing:** If necessary, the higher seed will be determined by a “coin flip.”

**MORE THAN TWO TEAMS TIED:** If more than two teams have the same record after the first four games, the following criteria (in order) will be utilized:

**Point differential:** The team with the greater point differential will receive the higher seed.

**Total Points:** The team with the most total points will receive the higher seed.

**Random drawing:** If necessary, the higher seed will be determined by a coin flip.

## NBA 2K24 SUMMER LEAGUE PLAYING RULES

*The following rules apply to all games at NBA Summer League. Unless noted otherwise below, all other NBA rules apply.*

### GAME FORMAT

- Both teams are allowed 10 minutes to warm up on the game court prior to the start of each game.
- Regulation games are composed of four 10-minute quarters.
- The length of halftime is eight minutes.

### FOULS

- A team reaches the penalty either on its 10<sup>th</sup> team foul of the half or second team foul committed in the last two minutes of each period.
- A player fouls out in any game (except the semifinal and championship games) after committing his 10<sup>th</sup> personal foul. In the semifinal and championship games, a player fouls out after committing his sixth personal foul.

### TIMEOUTS

- Each team has two full timeouts per half.
- A mandatory timeout will be taken at the first stoppage of play after the 5:59- and 2:59-mark of each period.
- A timeout taken by a team will negate the next mandatory timeout due in that period (although a mandatory timeout will not count against a team's timeout total if it occurs prior to either team calling its first timeout of the half).
- Timeouts do not carry over to the second half.
- All timeouts will last one minute and 45 seconds.

### COACH'S CHALLENGE

- In the instance where a team's initial Challenge is successful, that team will be granted a second Challenge if it has a timeout available.
- The calls that may be reviewed via a Coach's Challenge at any point during the game are (i) a called foul, (ii) an out-of-bounds violation and (iii) a called goaltending/basket interference violations.
- Unlike a typical NBA game, referees will not have the ability to initiate replay reviews of goaltending/basket interference violations during the final two minutes of the fourth period or overtime.
- All other standard Coach's Challenge rules and procedures apply.

### REFEREE-INITIATED INSTANT REPLAY

The on-court referees possess the ability to initiate the following replay triggers at any point during the game:

- Player altercation.
- The referees are not reasonably certain whether a called foul met the criteria of a flagrant foul.
- A field goal is made with no time remaining at the end of any period.
- A foul is called with no time remaining at the end of any period.
- A play concludes either (i) with no time remaining at the end of any period or (ii) when the referees believe that time may have expired in any period and the referees are reasonably certain that the game clock malfunctioned during the play.

## TARGET SCORE IN OVERTIME

- A target score will be utilized for games that extend to overtime.
- Overtime will be untimed and games will end when a team makes a field goal or free throw to reach (or surpass) the target score.
- The overtime target score will be the tied score at the end of regulation plus seven points. For example, if the teams are tied at 100 at the end of regulation, the final target score would be 107.

## OTHER OVERTIME RULES

- Each team is allowed one timeout in the overtime period (regardless of how many timeouts a team called in the second half).
- The free throw penalty begins on the second team foul. Otherwise, all standard NBA free throw rules will apply.
- All two-minute rules apply for the entire overtime period.

## INSTANT REPLAY PROCEDURES

- All replay reviews (including those triggered by a Coach's Challenge) will be conducted by the on-site Replay Center.
- The Replay Center will make the final ruling on all replays, except that the on-court referees will review: (i) a player altercation, (ii) a potential flagrant foul and (iii) a called foul being reviewed pursuant to a Coach's Challenge.

## EXPERIMENTAL INSTANT REPLAY PROCEDURE

The league will test the following replay-related technologies in an effort to enhance game flow:

- Communication from the On-Site Replay Center to the Crew Chief via Headset: This experimental procedure will enable the Replay Center to notify the crew chief of replay reviews decided by the Replay Center in real time.
- Communication from the On-Site Replay Center to the Crew Chief via Smartwatch Technology: This experimental procedure will enable the Replay Center to notify the crew chief in real time if a scoring error occurred.

## NBA 2K24 SUMMER LEAGUE: DID YOU KNOW?

- This year marks the 18<sup>th</sup> NBA Summer League in Las Vegas. The competition has been held every year since 2004 except in 2011 and 2020.
- All 30 NBA teams will play at NBA Summer League for the fifth straight time (2018, 2019, 2021, 2022 and 2023).
- Every game of the NBA 2K24 Summer League will air live on national television, with ESPN networks (ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPNNews) and NBA TV combining to televise all 76 games.
- NBA Summer League debuted in 2004 with six NBA teams playing a total of 13 games. The teams were the Boston Celtics, Cleveland Cavaliers, Denver Nuggets, Orlando Magic, Phoenix Suns and Washington Wizards.
- In 2013, NBA Summer League introduced a tournament-style schedule that culminated with a championship game.
- The NBA Summer League champions by year have been the Golden State Warriors (2013), Sacramento Kings (2014), San Antonio Spurs (2015), Chicago Bulls (2016), Los Angeles Lakers (2017), Portland Trail Blazers (2018), Memphis Grizzlies (2019), Kings (2021) and Trail Blazers (2022).
- The Sacramento Kings (2014 and 2021) and Portland Trail Blazers (2018 and 2022) are the two teams to win the NBA Summer League championship more than once.
- The 2015 NBA Summer League champion San Antonio Spurs were coached by Becky Hammon, who was the first female Summer League head coach.
- The Los Angeles Lakers and Portland Trail Blazers met in the NBA Summer League championship game in back-to-back years (2017 and 2018). The Lakers won in 2017 and the Trail Blazers won in 2018.
- Thirteen players selected first overall in the NBA Draft have played at NBA Summer League before their rookie seasons: Dwight Howard (No. 1 in 2004), Andrea Bargnani (2006), Greg Oden (2007), Blake Griffin (2009), John Wall (2010), Andrew Wiggins (2014), Karl-Anthony Towns (2015), Ben Simmons (2016), Markelle Fultz (2017), Deandre Ayton (2018), Zion Williamson (2019), Cade Cunningham (2021) and Paolo Banchero (2022).
- Six active players to win the Kia NBA Most Valuable Player Award have played at NBA Summer League: Kevin Durant (who played in 2007), Stephen Curry (2009), Russell Westbrook (2009), James Harden (2009), Giannis Antetokounmpo (2014) and Nikola Jokić (2015).
- Twelve players have played at NBA Summer League before winning the Kia NBA Rookie of the Year Award: Chris Paul (who played in 2005), Brandon Roy (2006), Kevin Durant (2007), Tyreke Evans (2009), Blake Griffin (2009), Damian Lillard (2012), Andrew Wiggins (2014), Karl-Anthony Towns (2015), Malcolm Brogdon (2016), Ben Simmons (2016), Scottie Barnes (2021) and Paolo Banchero (2022).
- Three NBA Summer League MVPs have gone on to become NBA All-Stars: Blake Griffin (2009 Summer League MVP), John Wall (2010) and Damian Lillard (co-MVP in 2012).
- Single-game record holders at NBA Summer League include Anthony Morrow for points (47), Malcolm Thomas for rebounds (22) and Marcus Williams for assists (17).
- Three non-NBA teams have played at NBA Summer League: the NBA G League Select Team (seven straight appearances from 2009-16), the Chinese National Team (2007 and 2019) and the Croatian National Team (2019).
